FEBRUARY 2025 OVERVIEW

Routine Work with Eva and Lhamo

Our daily care and activities with Eva and Lhamo continued steadily throughout February. Both elephants are in good health and remain under constant supervision. Since relocating from Sauraha to Amaltari, we have experienced a notable reduction in operational expenses—particularly in the cost of elephant food, hay, and staff meals. This has allowed us to begin saving for future projects, an important step in ensuring the long-term sustainability of our work.

Volunteer Program

We were happy to welcome volunteers once again this month. The volunteer program plays a vital role in our organization, not only by supporting our daily work at the sanctuary, but also by spreading awareness about elephant welfare. Additionally, it offers meaningful training and hands-on experience to the new generation of elephant lovers and advocates, which aligns perfectly with our long-term vision.

SOS Elephant - External Assistance Program

The SOS Elephant program continues to run smoothly. SU4E is still providing daily food support for Ramu, a 36-year-old male elephant in Sauraha who has been chained in the same spot for several years. Thanks to a new partnership with The Call to Conserve, a nonprofit working to support elephants and mahouts across Asia, we are now also covering the salary of Ramu's sole mahout—ensuring both elephant and caretaker receive the support they need.
